

## RRREMD Meeting Preamble

Good morning/afternoon, my name is \_\_\_\_\_, the current Chair of the Red Rock Road Enhancement Maintenance District (RRREMD). The RRREMD is a special taxing district created by the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors in 2008. It was formed pursuant to Title 48 of the Arizona Revised Statutes to provide maintenance of various enhancements, including landscaping, pedestrian lighting, benches, trash receptacles and banners, along SR 179 between milepost 305.45 and 307.08.

The RRREMD consists of a five elected Board members. Three or more Board members present constitutes a legal quorum and any motion must be passed by a simple majority vote of the Board members present.

The meeting will be held in accordance with A.R.S. Title 38, Open Meeting Laws. The Board will open the floor for public participation during each agenda item. Anyone wishing to speak must fill out a Public Participation Form and deliver it to the Chair. When recognized by the Chair, please come to the front of the room, state your name and limit your comments to two minutes. Please keep your comments brief and do not repeat comments previously stated. If a number of people have a similar view, it is suggested that one person speak for the group.

All public participation must pertain to the current agenda item and any comments not within the current agenda item may be stricken. If you do not wish to speak but would like your comments to be part of the record, please check "I wish to provide the following written comments". Your written comments will be read into the record.

In addition, the public will be given the opportunity to comment to the Board on non-agenda item issues pertaining to the District. Board members cannot discuss items that are not specifically identified on the agenda. Therefore, pursuant to A.R.S. 38-431.01(H), action taken as a result of non-agenda public comment will be limited to directing staff to study the matter, responding to any criticism or scheduling the matter for further consideration and decision at a later date. Two minutes will be allowed for each speaker.

Please note that your comments may be recorded and will become a public record.
